72% for Bamfield! Waste Water Report, February, 2021. The new waste water treatment plant will service Bamfield's east side and Upper Anacla. The plant can process and treat enough sewage for 1100 people. It has the ability built in to double that amount in the future. The usage is approximately split up between Marine Science Centre (18%), HFN (10%), and the balance dedicated to Bamfield (72%). HFN controls the operation and maintenance of the plant. As of now the cost for hooking up to the system has not been calculated and will be in the near future. There is some discussion to create an outlet on the east side that would allow pumped sewage solids from the west side to be dumped into the system but nothing is confirmed. Douglas Greer. Our Valuable Community Forest.** The Bamfield Huu-ay-aht Community Forest held the first of two Ecosystem Based planning sessions with celebrated RPF and forest ecologist Herb

Hamond. Subjects covered included the importance of multi-layered canopies and decaying wood, the connectivity and importance of water through the forest, and approaches to planning forest use. Ecosystem based planning prioritizes protection to ensure the continued function of the forest ecosystem, and considers as a second priority what uses may be made of the remaining forest. The second session will be March 18 and will include approaches to forestry for our community forest specifically. Please
